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WHAT IS GLEANING?

Gleaning is the act of collecting left over crops after a field has been commercially harvested or when it is not economically profitable for the farmer to harvest the crop.

As a gleaning volunteer, you will receive an e-mail or phone call when there is an upcoming gleaning opportunity. Working with your schedule, we will establish the best time to get the gleaning started! Before the first gleaning you will be briefed on protocol, given tips for harvesting and receive an intro to gleaning packet. Unless otherwise specified, we will coordinate transportation and obtain necessary tools.



FOOD WASTE

Up to one-fifth of America's food goes to waste each year, with an estimated 130 pounds of food per person ending up in landfills. The annual value of this lost food is estimated at around \$31 billion. But the real story is that roughly 49 million people could have been fed by those lost resources.*
